Privacy Policy

The American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology (ABPN) has adopted the following Privacy Policy applicable to the collection, use and disclosure of personal information that it may receive in its certification and continuing certification processes and programs. The ABPN has developed, implemented and maintains reasonable safeguards of the private information, including but not limited to disposal of data. As such, notwithstanding what is below, the ABPN complies with all applicable security and privacy safeguards, such as HIPAA and HITECH, as well as New York's SHIELD Act.

The ABPN considers the certification status of individuals to be public information and the ABPN will publish and/or make available upon request an individual's certification status. As such, the ABPN routinely reports and/or discloses, through its website or otherwise, whether an individual is certified or not certified. If an individual was previously certified by the ABPN, but no longer is certified by the ABPN, the dates of former ABPN certification will also be routinely reported and/or disclosed.

The ABPN also routinely provides a diplomate's certification information and status as well as personal identifying information, including full name, mailing address, email address, last 4-digits of the social security number, birth date, telephone number, and facsimile number to the American Board of Medical Specialties (ABMS) which publishes the Official ABMS Directory of Board Certified Medical Specialists and the Federation of State Medical Boards (FSMB) and other third parties the ABPN determines to be reasonable and in the interest of the ABPN to fulfill its mission and purposes.

In addition, the ABPN provides a diplomate's certification information and status and personal identifying information, including full name, mailing address, email address, ABMS number, ABPN certifications held and the certificate numbers of such certifications, and dates certificates and/or diplomate status were awarded and expire to professional medical societies, associations and other entities and organizations that provide ABPN-accepted educational resources, services and/or products used for the certification and/or continuing certification programs or other third parties conducting ABPN-approved research involving certification status for whom the ABPN contractually requires the recipient(s) to treat the transferred information confidentially in accordance with this Privacy Policy.

The ABPN provides residency and fellowship training programs the names of applicants and the performance on any and all of the ABPN's examinations and/or continuing certification components taken at any time.

The ABPN will also, at its discretion, release information contained in an individual's application for certification or continuing certification, individuals' examination results and examination scores to researchers selected by the ABPN to study the testing and evaluation programs of the ABPN.

The ABPN will disclose pertinent information it possesses about any individual who it determines has violated ABPN rule and/or procedures; engaged in misrepresentation, unprofessional and/or unethical behavior; or whose certification was revoked or determined to be invalid.

The ABPN will disclose all non-privileged, relevant information in its possession in response to a lawful subpoena, court order or an authorized request by a government and/or regulatory entity.

The ABPN will disclose all non-privileged, relevant information about a candidate, applicant and/or Diplomate in its possession upon written authorization from the specific candidate, applicant and/or Diplomate.
